Foreword

At the Pittsburgh Convention of the 4th Armored Division Association in 1979, Hoby Drew, while riffling the pages of "Patton's Third Army at War", (see footnote) was leading a spirited discussion on who was driving and commanding tanks at Singling in France early in December 1944. In the soil of rambling reminiscences, watered by fading memories, sprouted the idea of reconstituting the whole company as it was the day it crossed the Channel to France. Knowing how we started out would then help sort out the rapid changes brought about by battle casualties. Everyone with the Company before and after the crossing must be included for all had a hand in the forging of the Company and many a humble crewman rose through the turrets to leadership in battle. Herein lies the source of our pride. We believe that the very essence and glory of every unit of our great Division was based on thorough training, outstanding leadership, mutual respect, and love for each other.

Early on it became evident, since no one walked, that we had to establish the T.O. for vehicles as well as for men. The Center of Military History (U.S.Army) kindly supplied TO&E 17-27 of 18 November 1944 which included all the changes in manpower and vehicles from September 1943 (Regiments to Battalions) and thus covered the organization of B Company in July 1944. There was, however, one change that T.O. does not reflect; namely, the assignment of one medium tank each from A,B, and C Companies to then Colonel Abrams' Battalion Headquarters. Major (now Major-General Retired) Ed Bautz, Battalion S-3, got our tank with four men.

Thus, the actual T.O. on July 10-11,1944 reflects: Vehicles:

16 Tanks-75MM guns (the 17th to Bn.Hq.)

1 Tank-105MM Howitzer-The Assault Gun

1 Half-Track

2 Peeps

1 Kitchen Truck

1 VTR (Vehicle Tank Recovery)

Note: a second truck, perhaps borrowed from Service Company, can be postulated and would be convenient to reduce the ten man total assigned the Kitchen Truck and Half-Track. We do not think there was one.

113(The T.O. counting the 4 above has 117) Since we can count 117 names, it appears we were 4 overstrength.

Footnote: British author Lt.-Col. George Forty R.T.R. (Royal Tank Regiment) included in his book pictures of B Co.'s 1st Platoon and of Drew, furnished by our Jimmie Leach. This memoir is divided into 5 parts:

Part 1 - A Table of Organization by Rank

Part 2 - The Calculation of the Actual Crossing Strength

Part 3 - An Outline of the Company - Each man in his vehicle

Part 4 - Our Dead - Killed in Action

Part 5 - An alphabetical list of men-all who could be rememberedfrom Pine Camp in 1941 to Czechoslovakia in 1945, together with home towns and appropriate notations. As more names are recalled they will be added in a future edition of the memoir.

Of special interest in Part 3 is the near perfect recall of the name of every vehicle except, alas, for that of the Half-Track.

The author of this project is the Company itself. I am but the scribe, remembering little of B Co.'s days in England prior to crossing to France since I was then in Battalion Headquarters. Previous memoranda on this endeavor have cited numerous comrades with remarkable memories but it would now be necessary to list just about everyone. By word of mouth, photographs, letters, lists, local and long distance telephone calls, everyone approached has eagerly responded. We have even found long-lost comrades in the process. Let us now all share in the work we all have produced.

Each Tank Battalion of the Division had a Medical Detachment consisting of two Doctors and eighteen men. (T/O 17-25), change of June 16, 1944). Dr, John R. Scotti was Battalion Surgeon and Dr. Charles Voltz his Assistant, and later Battalion Surgeon upon the departure of Dr. Scotti to a Combat Command. Dr. Scotti assigned two men to each line company and the others, attached to Hq. Co., served as needed to augment or replace their comrades. One was a permanent Ambulance Driver.
